International Noise Awareness Day: Noisedirect's Noise Tzar will be joining hands with campaigners around the world to raise awareness of the dangers of noise to health and hearing



27 April 2011

The 16th International Noise Awareness Day (1) takes place this year on Wednesday 27th April, two days before the Royal Wedding. But Noisedirect (2) will be making its own vows to continue providing low cost, independent, impartial, professional advice service for both noise sufferers and noise makers.

As a previous noise sufferer herself, Val Weedon (3), Noisedirect's newly appointed Noise Tzar, knows only too well how important it is for people with noise problems to seek help from someone who is sympathetic and has the sole interest in helping as best as possible.

Noisedirect says:

"Val speaks for the ordinary person and understands what it is like to have a noise problem and how it can take over your life. We are deeply honoured that a veteran campaigner like Val has agreed to help us improve our services and will help spread the message that ordinary people don't need to suffer in silence and no matter how protracted a problem, there are solutions available."

In a recent response to the UK government's White Paper on health (4), Val said:

"Whilst I am heartened in my role as Noise Tzar that the government is committed to reducing 'the percentage of the population affected by

environmental, neighbour and neighbourhood noise' based on years of my campaigning experience I firmly believe that this can only be achieved through a raft of positive measures"

These include:

- A pledge to ring fence government funding to enable Environmental Health Departments to expeditiously carry out statutory functions under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and Housing Act 2004.
- Introduce legislation to allow individuals to appoint and authorise Independent Environmental Health Practitioners (registered with the Chartered Institute of Environmental Health) to act on their behalf to help improve the health of individuals and communities by serving Hazard Awareness and Nuisance Notices, on behalf of individuals, where issues affecting public health exists.
- Amend the provisions of the Housing Act 2004 to allow any person aggrieved by a Category 1 Noise Hazard within their dwelling, to apply to the local Magistrates Court for the abatement of the Hazard.
- Stop the postcode lottery for investigating noise complaints. Where local authorities fail to carry out inspections in accordance with their statutory duties under the Environmental Protection Act 1990 and Housing Act 2004, then the Local Government Ombudsman should be granted powers to impose a £25 fixed penalty victim fine payable to Councils to complainants.
